It was Michael who introduced me to the Administration of Western Albermarle when I was considering a career change and also to the shipping and transportation people in the UK when I was importing my Volvo. He always knew the right "go to" people.

Michael was also an expert travel advisor and tour guide. If you never took a trip to the UK led by Michael, you truly missed something. The trip in 2003 that Sue and I, as well as a dozen SVBCC members, took is a highlight of our lives. We traveled by planes, trains, and automobiles to visit everything from castles, race tracks, car museums and factories, Shakespeare's home, the Crown jewels, and even saw Samson! (I have never laughed as hard in my life (with Ken Brasfield) at that dinner.) Truly unforgettable events thanks to Michael and his impeccable planning.

1). The Royal Windsor Castle trip began in February 2009, when I was invited by the MG car club to take part in a very prestigious 85th Anniversary of the MG car.

The Rally and Royal Cavalcade event took place in June 2009, in the ancient royal town of Windsor and ended up with a Royal wave and drive by in front of HRH Prince Philip.

Only two weeks before the event, I was contacted to say I was allowed to bring one VIP guest as my passenger. I decided to email all my UK and American car friends about the invite, I said, "who ever contacted me first, could come on the VIP trip", and within an hour, Michael had contacted me, he immediately booked a plane ticket, and joined me two weeks later. We had a fantastic time on the rally and Windsor town cavalcade, and we both met Prince Philip together.

2.) The quadruple Mini purchase trip began one week in the summer of 2014, when Michael was in the UK purchasing Minis near Heathrow - London with myself. At the end of the trip, he decided that he would purchase four Minis from one dealer that we had met near Heathrow. He contacted the dealer on the last Sunday of the trip, and the dealer said that Michael would need to deliver cash deposits for each Mini on that Sunday afternoon to secure all the Minis.

So Michael and I drove to Heathrow on a Sunday afternoon, and between us, we made multiple big cash withdrawals in every ATM machine we could find in the town, and we ended up emptying 5 different ATM machines completely! I was luckily wearing an old Barbour wax shooting jacket with a big inside poachers pocket, so Michael and I filled my poachers pocket up completely with a bulging cash stash, and then quickly drove to the dealers personal house in Heathrow and delivered all the stash as cash deposits for securing all the Minis.

It was a memorable, very funny Sunday afternoon emptying lots of cash from all of Heathrow's ATM machines with Michael.

You only had to ask and he was always there with a ready answer, a direction to take, or with advice as to timing or approach. He was the Club Guru. An image that cemented itself for me of the essential Michael was at a Renaissance Faire at Natural Chimneys which he and Rhonda sponsored. We were to be in period costume... and Michael appeared as a robed Druid, with the flowing beard and sandals! Shrewd, sensible, patient, a man of thoughtful action, and filled with a wonderful joyous spirit, Michael, I will miss you in this world.
