“The first standard electronic ABS system in a production car was the Sure-Trak electronic system in the 1971 Lincoln Continental Mark III.

Mike also noted that in 1965 Jensen incorporated ABS (Maxaret) on their 1965 CV8 FF (a one-off prototype) which also offered 4 wheel drive. Two years later, in 1967, the production Jensen Interceptor FF was equipped with Dunlop Maxaret mechanical ABS and traction control.”
